

MAVI28 FIRST ANNOUNCEMENT

Gijon, Spain

September 20 — 23, 2022

The 28th International Conference on *Mathematical Views* (MAVI28) will take place in Gijon, Spain, from the **evening of September 20, 2022** (starting with a welcome reception and a social event) to the morning of **September 23, 2022** (ending **right before lunch**).



About the conference

The overall topic of the conference is the broad area of affect in mathematics education. The aim of the conference, on the one hand, is to present research results from topics related to affect including attitudes, beliefs, emotions, identity, interest, meaning, motivation, values, and the like. It does not matter whether you are interested in theoretical considerations or empirical research. We welcome contributions on learning, teaching, or using mathematics at any educational level or at work. On the other hand, we want to intensively discuss these topics. Thus, it is in the heart of the MAVI spirit that there will be enough time to engage in in-depth discussions after each presentation.

MAVI28 will have **a special session** dedicated to **affective and cognitive issues related to mathematics teacher education**. We strongly encourage scholars outside the affect-related research in Mathematics Education, but interested in engaging in discussions and collaborations on this topic, to submit a proposal to be presented and discussed at MAVI28.

MAVI28 has two keynote speakers, which we proudly introduce:

Nuria Planas, Associate Professor in Mathematics Education at the Autonomous University of Barcelona, Spain. In 2013 was awarded for ICREA Academia Professorship, Catalan Institution of Research and Advanced Studies, and for the period 2013-2016 she was awarded as Extraordinary Professor by Department of Mathematics Education, College of Education, University of South Africa, Pretoria, and renewed for the years 2017-2020. She has been a member of the Committee of Education, European Mathematical Society (two consecutive terms, 2009-2016), of the Executive Committee of the Spanish Society for Research in Mathematics Education (2012-2015), of the Scientific Programme Committee of the XVII, XVIII and XIX Annual Symposia of the Spanish Society for Research in Mathematics Education (2013, 2014 & 2015), of the International Committee of the 21 ICMI Study, 'Mathematics Education and Language Diversity', of the International Commission on Mathematical Instruction (2008-2014), of the International Programme Committee of the 21 ICMI Study Conference, 'Mathematics Education and Language Diversity' (2010-2011), of the International Committee of the International Group for the Psychology of Mathematics Education (2010-2014), and Chair of the 'Mathematics and Language' TWG of the European Society for Research in Mathematics Education (since 2013). Nuria's research interests concern mostly sociocultural classroom research on language, and her most recent research deals with sociocultural and sociolinguistic aspects of mathematics



teaching as deployed in PD settings. Her underlying stances on values and norms towards language responsiveness in mathematics content teaching are thus sociocultural.

Pietro Di Martino, Full Professor in Mathematics Education at the University of Pisa, Italy. He is the Rector's delegate for Teacher Training. He is currently the President of the Master degree in primary and pre-primary teacher education, and a Member of the Teaching Committee of the PhD school in Mathematics in Pisa. He has been the President of the Italian Committee for the teaching of mathematics (CIIM) promoted by the Italian Mathematical Union from 2019 to 2021.

His research interests focus on students' difficulties in mathematics and on cognitive and affective issues in mathematics teacher education. Pietro is also a senior friend in MAVI, as he attended also the very first MAVI conferences. He had been also the leader of the TWG *Affect and mathematical Thinking* for two editions of the Conference of the European society for Research in Mathematics Education (CERME).



Conference Fee

The conference fee for regular conference attendance is **570 €**. Included in the regular fee are:

- accommodation in the hotel Begona Park for 3 nights (September 20-22), in a single room with breakfast included,
- attendance to the conference + proceedings for authors,
- coffee breaks + lunch tickets for September 21 and 22,
- the social program, the welcome reception on Sept. 20 evening (dinner) and the social dinner.

Conference fee is almost “all inclusive”: you just have to add the cost of the travel to Gijón and one dinner!

There are **reductions** for:

- those who want to share a double room: 520 euros per person;
- accompanying persons (staying in a double room with a participant who pays the double-room regular fee): 135 euros;
- students: the reduced fee with accommodation in a single/double room is 480/420 euros, respectively.

In case a participant needs to include an extra night, or more, and an extra meal, or more, to the conference fee, please contact the organisers via email (mavi28@uniovi.es) and they will start a negotiation with the hotel so as to have a convenient price.

A non-refundable pre-registration fee is due after the confirmation of acceptance for the first review step. Regular pre-registration fee is 125 euros, student pre-registration fee is 60 euros. A student's status should be confirmed by a letter from one's advisor.

Important Deadlines

June 10, 2022	Payment of the non-refundable pre-registration fee. Invitation to act as a reviewer for two papers (possible outcomes: “accepted as it is for the presentation at the conference”, “accepted for presentation with minor revisions”, “accepted for presentation with major revisions”)
June 10-30, 2022	Time for reviewing
July 10, 2022	Decisions letters sent to the authors
August 25, 2022	Submission of revised papers, final registration to the conference, payment of the registration fee

Submission of Papers

All submitted papers should explicitly address the field of math-related attitudes, beliefs, emotions, identity, interest, meaning, motivation, values, etc in Mathematics Education. Papers should be max. 10 pages using PME format. The papers must be submitted via email to mavi28@uniovi.es before May 10, 2022.

By submitting a paper to the conference, you agree to review two papers submitted by other colleagues. The time for doing the reviews is between June 10 to 30, 2022. The peer review process is not blind. Guidelines for the reviewers will be provided on the conference website and via email to all contributing authors. Results will be announced by July 10, 2022.

Travel information

AIR CONNECTIONS

The Asturias Airport (IATA Code: OVD) is located in the town of Santiago del Monte.

Air connections with the main Spanish cities: Madrid, Barcelona, Valencia, Alicante and Malaga. Direct flights nowadays working only with Paris and London (Vueling) , but it has been announced that in Summer 2022 they will start connections to Düsseldorf, Brussels, and Rome (Ryanair), Amsterdam (Vueling) and Milano-Bergamo (Volotea). On the Asturias airport website you can find information on the airlines that fly from/to this airport ([link](#)).

Other nearby airports are: Santander (about 2 hours of driving distance) and Bilbao (about 3 hours of driving distance), which are also connected with more International destinations. The ALSA bus company offers direct coaches to Gijón from Santander and Bilbao airports.

How to get from the airport to Gijon?

The Airport is located 48 km from Gijón (about 35 minutes), connected by a motorway (A-8).

Three options to get to the city:

- **TAXI:** In the same airport there is a taxi rank, which remains in service until the arrival of the last flight. Amount by Taxi: €45 – €60 to/from Gijón.
- **BUS:** The ALSA (www.alsa.es) company offers daily coach services Gijón Airport – Gijón. Price of the bus: €9.00, departures every hour.
- **CAR RENTAL:** Four companies provide their services with extensive hours (they also have offices in Gijón): Avis, Europcar, Hertz Spain, Nacional Atesa

RAILWAY

Rail services that daily connect Gijón with Madrid (about 5 hours) and other cities in Spain by RENFE (www.renfe.com).

Please note that there is no train connection between Gijón and the Asturias Airport

Daily bus links with Madrid and the main Spanish cities with ALSA company (www.alsa.es).
